

Update to the Export Administration Regulations Jun 29th 2020

Changes to U.S. Export Administration Regulations (EAR) June 29th 2020

On June 29th 2020 the U.S. Department of Commerce made several changes that impact Future Electronics, namely the removal of the CIV license exception and the tightening of controls around parts going to military end uses and end users in China, Russia and Venezuela. The full list of ECCNs affected by these regulations can be found in the links below, but some of the ones commonly sold by Future Electronics are 3A991, 5A991 & 5A992. In order to comply with these changes Future Electronics may request further certifications that parts will not be used by military end users or for military end uses as defined in the regulations. If it comes to your attention that parts sourced from Future are destined to any such end use or end user we ask that you let us know as soon as possible so that we can apply for the required export licenses.
