
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

Figure 1: V22B Drive Current vs. Voltage




Figure 3: V22D Drive Current vs. Voltage




Figure 5: V22C Typical Relative Flux vs. Current




Figure 2: V22C Drive Current vs. Voltage




Figure 4: V22B Typical Relative Flux vs. Current





Figure 6: V22D Typical Relative Flux vs. Current

Figure 7: Typical DC Flux vs. Case Temperature




Figure 9: Typical DC ccy Shift vs. Case Temperature




Figure 11: V22D Drive Current vs. ccy Shift




Figure 8: Typical DC ccx Shift vs. Case Temperature




Figure 10: V22D Drive Current vs. ccx Shift





Figure 12: Derating Curve




Figure 13: Typical Spatial Radiation Pattern



Figure 15: Typical Color Spectrum



- 4. Dimensions for each tube are $30.7 \text{ (W)} \times 9.65 \text{(H)} \times 460 \text{(L)}$. Dimensions for the anti-static bag are $120 \text{mm} \text{ (W)} \times 635 \text{mm} \text{ (L)} \times 0.1 \text{ (T)} \text{ mm}$. Dimensions for the shipping box are $58.7 \times 13.3 \times 7.9 \text{ cm}$.
